Concession Conditions

Section A - Pensioner, Seniors and Impaired Servicepersons Concession

- Applicants must be residents of Queensland and holders of:
 - Pension Concession Card (Qld issued)
 - Seniors Card (Qld issued)
 - DVA letter (containing a Qld issued Ref No.) stating that the applicant is at least:
 - 70% incapacitated under *Veterans Entitlement Act 1986*
 - or
 - has been assessed as at least 50 impairment points under the *Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2004*.
- If an application is made by mail, a copy of both sides of the relevant card must be provided.
- The concession applies to motor vehicles up to 4.5 tonnes GVM, motorbikes, motorised caravans and recreational ships.
- The vehicle or ship must be used mainly for the applicant's own private use.
- An eligible person may only receive one concession for their vehicle and one for their ship at any one time.
- Only one concession per couple will apply.
- If a vehicle or ship is registered in joint names the following conditions apply:
 - For a married couple or defacto, where both are eligible for a concession, either person may submit an application. If only one person is eligible, the application must be made by that person.
 - For other relationships, both persons must be eligible for a concession and each must submit an application.
- Sole parent concession card holders can only have concessional registration if they are the sole registered operator.
- Pension card holders will need to provide proof of their eligibility for concessional registration if they need to move the concession to another vehicle. All other concession types will only need to complete a Registration Concession Application to withdraw and apply the concession to their new vehicle.

Section B - Special Interest Vehicle Concession

Vehicles with both right-hand drive (RHD) and left-hand drive (LHD) that fall within one of the following categories:

- Vehicles (including tractors) at least 30 years old;
- Historic ambulances and fire-fighting equipment;
- Street Rods.

(Street Rods are vehicles that have been modified for safe road use and have a body and frame built before 1949, or is a replica and is fitted with a modification plate, code LH9. Vehicles fitted with a modification plate, code LH10, are for open registration and are not eligible for a Special Interest Vehicle Concession).

Conditions of use for vehicles

Conditions apply when these vehicles have been registered on a concession. Registered operators must meet specific requirements to be eligible for the concession. The registered operator must then continue to comply with the conditions when using their vehicle. These conditions are:

Club membership: Evidence of current membership with an incorporated car club or association must be provided at the time of application for a concession. Where a genuine reason is provided for not meeting this condition, it may be waived by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

Dating Certificate: The vehicle will need to be inspected by a club official of an incorporated car club to certify that the vehicle was manufactured not less than 30 years ago. This certificate, which must be on club letterhead or other official club documentation, will need to be presented when applying for a registration concession.

Lighting: If the vehicle does not have permanent lighting, then the registered operator must carry a removable lighting system with the vehicle at all times and use that system whenever lighting would normally be required. Carbide lights are acceptable where that type of light was originally fitted.

Use of vehicles registered with a Special Interest Vehicle Concession is restricted to the following:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated car clubs.
- Participating in processions for which a Special Event Permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management - Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Use for ceremonial purposes involving immediate family members, provided this is not done for fee or reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but not extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces.
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. There is no distance restriction in these circumstances however such travel must be reasonable and openly justified by the vehicle owner.
- In addition to the above street rods may participate in events sanctioned by the Australian Street Rod Federation.
- Heavy vehicles are permitted to carry a load provided the loaded GVM or GCM does not exceed 50% of the maximum permitted mass for the vehicle configuration.

This mass is determined based on the lesser of the following:

- individual axle ratings
- tyre manufacturer's limits
- manufacturer's GVM or GCM
- regulation mass limits

The load must be in relation to or part of the reason for, the vehicle's use under the scheme.

- Buses are permitted to carry non-paying passengers for journeys (joy rides) from an event (for example at a fete) and return provided the length of the journey does not exceed five kilometres. Payment of any kind cannot be made for these journeys.
- Road testing within a 15 kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged. The purpose of the travel must be to road test the vehicle following repair or restoration and not for any other purpose. The vehicle cannot also be used as a means of transport.
